## Synopsis of H.M.S. Pinafore

H.M.S. Pinafore (1878), is one of the most popular nautical melodramas by G&S, and its likability has served as an aid to the survival of this particular genre. The general characteristics of nautical melodrama include naval or militaristic qualities, patriotism, parody of historical events, and social conflicts. Some specific qualities of this genre that make it "nautical" include the setting, the "pirate-like" jargon, costumes, alliterative names, and patriotism. Typical characters could include the "high brow" captain of a ship, the scruffy yet handsome sailor, and the suffering female.

The main characters in H.M.S. Pinafore include Josephine, the captain's daughter, the "lowbrow" sailor, Ralph Rackstraw, and Sir Joseph Porter, the First Lord of the Admiralty that Josephine is expected to marry. Though Josephine's father is adamant that she marries Sir Joseph Porter, she controversially declares her love for Ralph Rackstraw. The plot twists at the end when Little Buttercup, the foster mother of the Captain and Ralph Rackstraw, reveals that she switched them at birth, turning the Captain into the low-class sailor, and Ralph Rackstraw into the high-class, suitable match for Josephine.

## The History of H.M.S. Pinafore

H.M.S. Pinafore; or, The Lass That Loved a Sailor is a comic opera in two acts, with music by Arthur Sullivan and a libretto by W. S. Gilbert. It opened at the Opera Comique in London, on 25 May 1878 and ran for 571 performances, which was the second-longest run of any musical theatre piece up to that time. H.M.S. Pinafore was Gilbert and Sullivan's fourth operatic collaboration and their first international sensation.


Drawing on several of his earlier "Bab Ballad" poems, Gilbert imbued the plot with mirth and silliness. The opera's humour focuses on love between members of different

social classes and lampoons the British class system in general. Pinafore also pokes good-natured fun at patriotism, party politics, the Royal Navy, and the rise of unqualified people to positions of authority. The title of the piece comically applies the name of a garment for girls and women, a pinafore, to the fearsome symbol of a warship.



Pinafore's extraordinary popularity in Britain, America and elsewhere was followed by the similar success of a series of Gilbert and Sullivan works, including The Pirates of Penzance and The Mikado. Their works, later known as the Savoy operas, dominated the musical stage on both sides of the Atlantic for more than a decade and continue to be performed today. The structure and style of these operas, particularly Pinafore, were much copied and contributed significantly to the development of modern musical theatre.

## The Pinafore Journey

The journey from planning stage to this evening, as far as this production goes, has had greater challenges than our two previous Gilbert & Sullivan productions in 2021 & 2022. As our 2023 play, 'Blithe Spirit', had a lower audience attendance than anticipated, this meant that costs had to be carefully examined before committing to this production. As it was for our previous two musicals, the quality of auditions and the number of auditionees was extremely pleasing and as a result, the audition panel were left with difficult decisions to make. The number of chorus members signing up to perform in this production caused a great sense of optimism amongst the Committee.

Rehearsals began in earnest led by our fantastic Musical Director, Jon Gibson, who ensured that the cast had excellent vocal practice of the show's musical numbers. It was early in the process that problems began to occur. Mainly due to ill health and changing job circumstances, the production lost a few of the principal cast.

However, with regards to the casting, willing replacements were available both from within the ensemble and previous auditionees. We would like to thank David Lawton, Jill Ratcliffe and Oliver Hingston for accepting principal roles only a matter of weeks before curtain up.

A special mention should go to our 'Hebe', Theresa Allcock, who was co-opted onto Committee when the society Secretary was taken ill in late August. Theresa ably took the reins and adminstrated and co-produced the pro-

sympathies to the family of Patricia Booth, a long time committee member, chorus member and friend to the Society who volunteered to prompt for this production but sadly passed away in October 2023; she will be greatly missed.

Though we have had setbacks, rehearsals have been fun and enjoyed by all and the setbacks have only steeled the resolve of the ensemble to bring you the best quality production that we can offer. The Society certainly hopes you enjoy the show!



## THE HASTORY OF N.M. a.O.D.S.

The North Manchester Amateur Operatic and Dramatic Society began its life in 1919 as the Simpson Memorial amateur Operatic and Dramatic Society, created from the merger of the Hanpurhey Dramatic Society and the Simpson Memorial Tennis Club. Our home has been the Simpson Memorial Hall on Moston Lane since 1919 and to this day, it is where we not only neheanse our productions, but where we penform most some of our dramatic productions and concerts.

Oun first musical show was 'The Mikado', which we performed at the Simpson Memorial Hall in 1920. However, in 1922 the Society needed a bigger venue for its first play, "Are you a Mason" and took the decision to perform this and 'The Pirates of Penzance' at Newton Heath Town Hall. In 1925, we then moved oun productions to the Queens Pank Hippodrome, starting with Mennie England and in 1927, 'folanthe.' 1929 found us on the move yet again, penforming at St John's Panochial Hall in Moston for our productions of 'Lilac Domino', 'Rebel Maid', 'Quaken Birl' and 'Katinka'. Then it was back to the Queens Pank Hippodnome until it closed in 1952.

To mank the closure of the theatre, the Society penformed the North West Premier of Annie Bet Your Dun'. We then moved to the Palladium (Cintra) on Rochdale Road and in 1954 revived 'The Desent Yong'. The Cintra was a long narrow theatre, with terrible acoustics and the audience had great difficulty in hearing what was going on. The effect on ticket sales was disastrous and support declined at an

In 1955, with falling attendances, the Society was at crisis point and a risky decision was made to move to the Palace Theatre in Manchester and put on Showboat. With a cast of over 100, it was an outstanding success and a profit of £600 was made. Meanwhile, the dramatic side had moved back to the Simpson. The glory days of the Palace continued until 1981 when rising costs forced the Society to move to the Royal Northern College of Music. The final show at the Palace was White Horse Inn' and we opened our spell at KNCM with 'The Menny Widow' continuing with 'The King and L', amongst others. Again, costs forced a move from kNCM in 1995 with the last show there being 'The Sound of Music'.

After that, our musical productions were staged at Middleton Civic Centre. Throughout the 1990s, the Society was able to perform two musical productions each year, but rising costs and the closure of Middleton Civic, meant that again, the society had to decide whether to continue or not. In order to stay afloat. MMQODS then had to curtail their musical shows, nelying on mainly concerts and TV stage adaptations to raise funds. This meant that many of our musical theatre members moved to pastures

In 2021, when we became financially able to penform musicals once more, we still had to be careful and could only penform licence-free Bilbert and Bullivan openettas, of which you are witnessing our third consecutive AES show. Because of this, we have, in the main, a new membership and hope to keep them for many shows to come.


